PLEASE HELP!

Unfortunately, the Sheriff's Department continues to receive calls for residential burglaries in Hidden Hills and our neighboring communities. The incidents follow the same pattern as previous "Chilean" type burglaries. This includes residents not being home, entry via a second story window, and items being taken that are easily concealable.

The Association is working closely with Covered 6, the City, and the LASD to keep our neighborhood safe and secure, but the primary responsibility for our safety and security, our homes, our families and our neighborhood, rests with **YOU**, our residents.

We encourage you to take every available precaution to protect your home and property from burglary.

Here are just a few suggestions:

- **If you see anything suspicious, call 911 BEFORE you call the gates, City or HHCA.**
- **Lock all doors and windows especially on the second story.**
- **Consider adding Motion Detector lights outside in vulnerable home areas and "glass break" sensors to your security system including second story windows.**
- **Whenever you leave (even for a quick errand or a meal):**
- **Arm your alarm. That's why it's there!**
- **Make your house look occupied:**
- **Leave lights and television(s) on and/or have automatic timers installed to turn lights on and off outside and in different rooms at different times.**
- **If you are going to be away for a long period of time, ask a trusted neighbor to report any inconsistent activity on your property.**
- **If you will be traveling, contact City Hall to request a vacation check. Sheriff's Deputies will stop by your house several times while you are gone.**

If you would like to have a Sheriff's Deputy perform a security assessment at your home, please contact City Hall at **818-888-9281** and staff with help coordinate a visit.

Taking steps to make your home safer not only helps you and your family, it helps the whole community.

HORSES AND CARS IN HIDDEN HILLS

Horses are part of the landscape here in Hidden Hills, and have been for more than sixty years. The following information is presented to assist those who are unfamiliar with horses, or who are not used to sharing the road with horses.

Drivers should slow down when approaching and passing horses, and give them a wide berth, especially when horses are on the street. If a rider or person leading a horse indicates that you should slow down or stop, please do so - horses can be unpredictable and dangerous when frightened.

Drivers should be aware that they have a legal obligation to follow the instruction of riders or handlers of horses, per California Vehicle Code 21759:

"The driver of any vehicle approaching any horse drawn vehicle, any ridden animal, or any livestock shall exercise proper control of his vehicle and shall reduce speed or stop as may appear necessary or as may be signaled or otherwise requested by any person driving, riding or in charge of the animal or livestock in order to avoid frightening and to safeguard the animal or livestock and to insure the safety of any person driving or riding the animal or in charge of the livestock."

Drivers should be aware that equestrians are often forced to be on the roadway because of cars on the parkway, or in construction areas, where loud equipment and activity can startle horses.

Drivers should be alert for horses in the vicinity, especially when going over speed bumps and around corners- please slow down, and do not veer towards the dirt parkway to go around speed bumps- loud noises and the sudden approach of your vehicle can scare nearby horses and cause an accident.

WHAT'S LEAKING???

Here's a quick tip from one of your neighbors

For all of you who are shocked at the amount of water you are using and are dealing with the current water emergency, there's a tool that can help. If you have one of the "new" water meters installed at your house (most of you do), go to <https://lvmwd.watersmart.com/index.php/welcome> and register to use the WATERSMART tool that is available with detailed information of how much water you use on an hour-by-hour basis!

At 4am (and 5am and 6am) when I was sound asleep and there were no sprinklers running, I was using 4 gallons of water PER HOUR! That's almost 100 gallons every day! I checked all the toilets. Nothing. Then I walked around and looked at all the sprinkler valves, hose bibs, etc. and SURPRISE! Leaks, leaks and more leaks. Mostly worn washers (fairly easy to fix) and a couple of dribbling valves (a little tougher, but no big deal). Then, buried under some bushes (and directly adjacent to the foundation of my house!!!!) I discovered a muddy mess. One call to the plumber and a couple of hundred dollars later and presto! My Watersmart graph now shows under 1 gal is being used (pretty sure that means none). **Check it out:**
